Dallas Police Hockey Plays Charity Game to Honor Richardson Police Officer's Family

The Dallas Police Hockey team is playing the Richardson Police Hockey team in a special benefit game for #AllysLegacy. Richardson Police Officer Steve Hooten's 16-year-old daughter, Ally, was killed and his 13-year-old daughter, Sara, was severely injured back in January when a truck came off the road and hit them while they were on an ATV.

Ally Hooten's life has been an inspiration to those who knew her and her story is quickly spreading and inspiring those who didn't know her. Ally played basketball for Wylie Preparatory Academy and she always wanted a gym where her team could play. The Hooten Family has asked that all proceeds from the charity hockey game go to the school to build a gym in Ally's honor.

The hockey game will be Saturday, March 4th at the Farmers Branch StarCenter located at 12700 N. Stemmons Freeway, Farmers Branch, TX. Doors will open at 6:30 p.m. Admission is \$5 and the game will start at 7:30 p.m. There will be appearances by the Dallas Stars Ice Girls, Dallas Stars Mascot Victor E. Green, and Dallas Stars Alumni Gerald Diduck will be signing autographs. The Dallas Police Heroes will also be at the game and Dallas Police Officer Ray Vaughn will be singing the National Anthem.
