TO: Honorable Mayor and Members of the City Council

SUBJECT: Weekly Crime Briefing Report

The attached reports contain an analysis of major crimes in Dallas broken down for the fourteen council districts. The crime maps for each council district reflect the new boundaries and comparative analysis for year-to-date (2015), 5 year, and 11 year time periods. In addition, current crime rates are included for each major crime along with the year that Dallas experienced the same or a lower crime rate.

Over the last 11 years, Dallas has had the most dramatic drop in crime in its history. More than any north Texas city, more than any large city in the State, and more than any big city in the country. Much of this success during this period is attributable to the hard working men and women of the department, and the strong support of the Mayor, Council and the City Manager's Office.

The growth of the department from 2972 police officers to 3511 police officers, community engagement efforts, utilization of technology, data driven decision making of resource deployment, and a talented leadership team have all contributed to the department's success, as well.

During this period the size of the rank and file has increased by 600 while the size of the upper ranks has decreased by 13. From 2004 to present, the police officer rank increased by over 500 officers. Since 2012 the senior corporal rank increased by 50, the sergeant rank increased by 50, the lieutenant rank **decreased** by 25, the major rank was created to 14, the deputy chief rank **decreased** by 2, the captain rank and the assistant chief rank remained the same.

The department must continue to adapt its strategies and staffing model to an ever changing environment to continue to meet the public safety challenges of the City of Dallas. Criminal justice reform efforts, body worn cameras, civilianization and smart growth, succession planning and leadership transition, violent crime, and continued training.
